

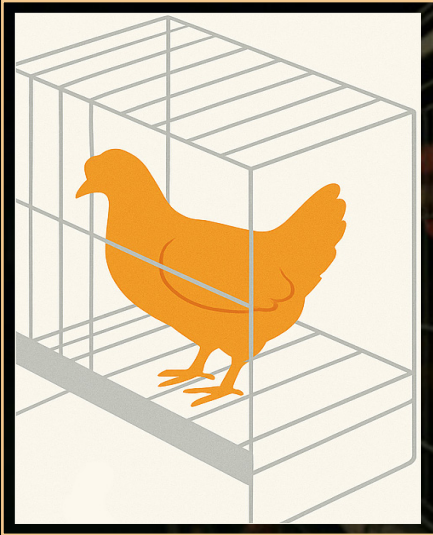

WHAT IS A BATTERY CAGE?



- A wire enclosure so small, a hen can't even spread her wings.
- Denies all natural behaviors: no perching, no nesting, no dustbathing.
- This intensive confinement causes severe stress and health issues.

It is a life of extreme limitation.



WHAT DOES CAGE-FREE REALLY MEAN?

**CAGE-FREE IS MUCH MORE THAN JUST A TREND.
IT'S BECOMING THE INDUSTRY STANDARD !!!**

- Hens live in open barns, not in cages.
- They have the freedom to: Walk, spread their wings, and socialize.
- They are provided with: Perches, litter for dustbathing, and private nest boxes.

“Battery cages present inherent animal welfare problems, most notably due to their small size and barren conditions. Hens are unable to engage in many of their natural behaviours and endure a high level of stress and frustration. Cage-free egg production while not perfect. Does not entail such inherent animal welfare disadvantages and is a very good step in the right direction for the egg industry.”
